HOSTING COMPETITIONS OVERVIEW

The Hosting Competitions pillar rewards clubs for their commitment and efforts made towards hosting quality competitions for junior players. With the overall goal aimed towards developing players, funding will be focused on the key stages of development in accordance with the Whole Player Development Pathway (WPDP).

Up to \$15,000 in annual funding available per club

HOW IT WORKS



HOSTING

Clubs host provincially sanctioned junior competitions.

Clubs interested in hosting tournaments need to reach out to their respective Provincial Tennis Association to receive an **official sanction** and access to their **tournament platform license**.



TRACKING

All tournaments operated through the national tournament's platform are automatically tracked.

When using the national tournament platform to organize tournaments, clubs must ensure they are using their own **club license to publish tournaments**.



POINTS

Clubs earn points for hosting a certain number of eligible junior tournaments.

Eligible tournaments include: **Rising Stars (U9/U10)** and **2 star, 3 star, 3.5 star, 4 star and 5 star** tournaments for **U12 and U14** age categories only.



FUNDING

Tennis Canada will fund and recognize the top 10 clubs by total points.

1-2	PLATINUM	\$15,000
3-4	GOLD	\$12,000
5-7	SILVER	\$6,000
8-10	BRONZE	\$3,000

HOSTING COMPETITIONS

Up to \$15,000 in annual funding available per club

Competition	Points Structure
Rogers First Set Tour – Rising Sars Tournaments	Outdoor Season (May to September)→ 1 point per event Indoor Season (October to April)→ 1.5 points per event
U12/U14 Tournaments	Outdoor Season (May to September)→ 1 point per event Indoor Season (October to April)→ 1.5 points per event
Additional hosting grants available for hosting Junior Nationals, ITF tournaments and OPEN 1000 events.	

WHAT COUNTS AS AN EVENT?

If a club hosts a U12/U14 **tournament over the weekend** and the tournament includes the following events: **U12 Boys, U12 Girls, U14 Boys, U14 Girls**. This one tournament would **count as 4 separate events** towards a club's total. Events must also have a **minimum draw size of 12** to count towards a club's total.

For U12/U14/U16/U18 the following events count towards a club's hosting total: **Provincial tournaments (2 star to 5 star)**

For Provincial **2, 3 and 3.5 star** tournaments, **only singles main draw events** will be counted. For all other **higher graded tournaments, singles qualifying and singles main draw events** will be counted.

RECOGNITION LEVELS

Top 10 clubs based on total points will receive funding and recognition:

 **PLATINUM** (\$15,000)
1st and 2nd place clubs

 **GOLD** (\$12,000)
3rd and 4th place clubs

 **SILVER** (\$6,000)
5th, 6th and 7th place clubs

 **BRONZE** (\$3,000)
8th, 9th and 10th place clubs
